Hospital- affiliated (BMC/BUSM) Department of Pediatrics, Infectious Diseases; Department of Psychiatry; Center for Multicultural Training in Psychology; BU Center for Global Health and Development

Community-based Located in Mattapan, serving Roxbury, Dorchester, Mattapan, South End, South Boston, Hyde Park, Jamaica Plain, West Roxbury, and greater metropolitan Boston, as well as from farther communities within driving distance

Medically-specialized, therapeutic education and care center offering integrated, comprehensive care across childhood

Developmental Behavioral Pediatrics

Provides services for:

- Ages 0-22 years
- Common referrals
 - Autism spectrum disorder
 - Attention-Deficit/Hyperactivity Disorder
 - Global Developmental Delay and Intellectual Disability
 - Learning Disability
 - Speech and Language Development Delay
 - Anxiety Disorders

Developmental Behavioral Pediatrics

Services Provided

- 3-Part Evaluation
 - Intake/history
 - Assessment/evaluation
 - Feedback
- Ongoing Follow-up

Multidisciplinary Team

- Developmental Behavioral Pediatricians
- Psychologists
- Nurse Practitioners
- Nurses



DBP Referrals

For evaluation:

PCP submits referral based on Team Up workflow

- For children ages 0-7 to Alyssa
- For children ages 8+ to general DBP

For ongoing follow-up:

PCP submits referral to general DBP

- If previously received care, will attempt to schedule follow-up with same clinician
- If prior clinician is unavailable or not previously seen in DBP at BMC, will be scheduled with one of the nurse practitioners

For Autism Behavior Clinic:

- Must be seen by a provider in DBP at BMC
- That provider can put in a referral for the family

****DBP is currently limiting referrals to certain insurance plans****
Change does not apply to Alyssa's Fast Track slots

Child Witness to Violence Project

Started in 1992, Grant Funded

Provides services for:

- Children 0-8 years old, CSP: 0-11 years old
- Witness domestic violence/community violence
- Separation from a primary caregiver

Evidence-based practices:

- Child-Parent Psychotherapy
- Trauma-Focused Cognitive Behavioral Therapy

Provides mental health services for:

- Children 0 – 18 years old
- Have experienced an important loss in their life
- Patients who get their primary care at BMC or an affiliated health center
- Residents of MA

We define loss in different ways:

- Death
- Incarceration
- Divorce
- Separation from a caregiver due to legal/immigration issues
- Anticipated loss

Our services:

- Caregiver consultations
- Short-term and Long-term therapy
- Grief training
